SCHOOL VISION

Our doors are open – everyone is welcome in Greenfylde C of E First School. As a school community we seek through shared service to support children, families and wider community; encouraging high expectation, hope and support for aspirations and an understanding that all deserve to receive and give respect and dignity.

This policy should be taken and used as part of Greenfylde C of E First School's overall strategy and implemented within the context of our vision, instrument of government, aims and values as a Church of England school as well as our policies for staff and pupil wellbeing.

OUR APPROACH

As a school we have a policy that is consistent with the Christian foundation set up with the local church and community. Within the school it is our aim to teach the children to develop a sense of curiosity about the world around them. At Greenfylde C of E First School we seek to find ways in which all areas of the curriculum can contribute to children's spiritual development and to highlight opportunities for these in our planning. We allow children the opportunity to explore and express feelings and emotions and provide opportunities for silence, stillness and prayer. We encourage children to develop relationships based on the Christian values of love, forgiveness and service to others. This fosters and supports their spiritual and moral development both now and into their adult lives.

Our policy has been shared and adopted by the Governing Body in consultation with the Headteacher and is consistent with our overall aims as a school – see School Vision above. It also takes account of the following guidance:

AIMS

At Greenfylde C of E First School, we aim to develop in every pupil:-

- A sense of self worth stemming from the recognition that they are created in the image of God
- A sense of being in relationship with others and a growing understanding of what it means to be a community
- An involvement with others in the wider world and an appreciation of difference and diversity
- A willingness to explore Christian beliefs and values through a knowledge of Bible stories and Christian teaching in order that these might become a firm foundation for life for those of a Christian background

- An openness to learn and understand about other faiths and traditions that reflects the diversity of our school and our community
- The ability to reflect upon experiences of awe, compassion and beauty etc.
- The ability to realise that experiences of disappointment, failure and loss may be occasions for spiritual growth and development
- The ability to explore the ultimate questions and mysteries of life

OPPORTUNITIES FOR SPIRITUAL/MORAL DEVELOPMENT

As a school we have an ethos and vision where the children will always be able to develop their values. The opportunities for weekly conversation time and teacher led collective worship will have specific teaching points that will often be related to their development specifically.

In order to develop the children's spiritual development we will provide opportunities for them to:

- Listen, reflect and question.
- Consider and discuss preferences and why.
- To develop their own values.
- To learn to understand that everyone has different values and beliefs.
- To learn and understand their feelings and responses to situations and feelings.
- To learn about life, changes and death.
- To learn about their own relationships with people and friends and family.

In terms of children's moral development we will provide opportunities for them to

- Develop a sense of right and wrong.
- To learn about the responses of people to their behaviours.
- Learn about the needs and feelings of others.
- Learn to respect others as they wish to be respected.
- To be able to understand their own reactions.
- Reflect on right and wrong.
- Question right and wrong.

These opportunities will be given across curriculum subject areas, in collective worship and in both planned and unplanned opportunities as situations occur in school.

Our opportunities will also be linked to our awareness and aims to instill in children the Christian Values for Schools listed below with a specific focus on three key values for Greenfylde, to develop a community that is caring, friendly and thankful:

Reverence - This is how we show respect in our everyday lives. It is also about us seeing wonder in the world around us.

Wisdom - This is about us learning what to do that is right in our lives.

Humility - As humans we need not to boast but to be humble and not always expect reward or praise.

Thankfulness – Our ability to say thank you for all the things in our lives.

Endurance - Our ability to keep going even when things may seem hard.

Service - Thinking about what we can do for others.

Compassion - Our ability to show kindness to others when they are sad.

Trust - This is our belief in other people, especially that they will do the right thing for us.

Peace - If we are at peace then we feel happy, well cared for and safe. We also want to help others find peace.

Forgiveness - Our ability to forgive others who we feel have done wrong towards us.

Friendship - Our ability to care and support others.

Justice - This is making sure everyone has what is right and fair in this world.

Hope - This is where we want something to happen. Where we may have dreams for the future.

Creation - Our ability to think about the world around us and to say thank you for the world we have.

Koinonia - Thinking about how we can all work together as together we are all stronger with support.

MONITORING AND EVALUATION

The opportunities for monitoring the children's spiritual and moral development will be through the planning and provision of opportunities in all areas of the curriculum. The R.E coordinator and Head teacher will monitor and evaluate the opportunities for spiritual and moral teaching through the children's' views and ability to question and respect.

Spiritual and Moral Development will be led by the Headteacher and all staff will access training in these areas as and when required.
