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You are all stars!

A year ago, none of us would probably have imagined we would be in a third national lockdown and we know that this is and remains, a difficult time for everyone. Nobody's story at this time will be the same, be it pressure from learning at home, working at home or out supporting the country as a critical or key worker but please take a moment to realise how much you have achieved. As a school, we want to be there for our community in whatever way we can as together we are stronger to get through this pandemic. Please keep supporting us by following all the lockdown guidance, just as we will as staff, so that we do minimise the number of contacts we meet to try and lower community transmission and reduce pressure on the NHS. It is so difficult when naturally as humans we are sociable beings but please try and ensure your children and families maintain social distancing and not meet with others beyond your household and sanctioned bubbles, in order to not only protect themselves but also those they may be with, especially those coming into school.



As a school, we currently have 45% of our school population in as critical workers or vulnerable children. We do look at each case on an individual basis and please do not be offended if we ask for proof as we will offer places in line with the guidance but also want to ensure we can maintain staffing and social distancing in classes (excluding Early Years where social distancing guidance is different). Please remember critical workers can be in if one parent qualifies but only if there is nobody left at home who could support the blended learning. Again, we would reiterate that every family has unique circumstances so we do ask that families do not speculate on the circumstances of others, rather if you wish to discuss your child you contact us at school.



We are very proud of the way our staff have adapted to this full blended learning model, especially as with numbers in, all class based staff are needed daily in school. This lockdown, as you may be aware is very different as this time, the Government have not disapplied the curriculum so learning continues at home and school and teachers are ensuring children are not disadvantaged either way in the curriculum they are following. Staff are always available to answer any questions on the learning and can be contacted by Tapestry, Class DoJo or via the school office. We do appreciate that blended learning can feel quite daunting for some, so remember we are here to help but do ask that staff are approached respectfully as they are also managing their own needs in this pandemic like every other family.

Government guidance is that children in Key Stage 1 should complete 3 hours learning a day and 4 hours for those in Key Stage 2. Please note this is not expected to be done in one sitting and rather we would suggest lots of breaks, including movement breaks to make this more manageable. Also, don't feel you need to do hours to complete one subject, if your child is getting stuck better to stop after a reasonable time and let the teacher know so that they can support any misconceptions.

We have loved having our community back together with the Zoom class meetings and worships and would encourage all to engage in these to keep that sense of Greenfylde belonging. If you have lost any links for these, please contact Hannah our Receptionist via the school office.

Free School Meal Vouchers

Now that the Government has reopened the voucher scheme, those eligible for free school meals and not in school will be receiving electronic vouchers via email next week.
