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Ilminster Literary Festival Poetry Recital Final

Somerset Cricket Olympics

We have had an excellent result in the Somerset Cricket Olympics – Greenfylde has come 3rd out of 30 Somerset schools! There were five parts to the competition to encourage the children to develop skills in throwing, bowling, catching and batting. Well done to all involved and the prize is half a term's coaching for key stage 2 in September with a Somerset cricket coach.



Water Bottles/hats



Learning at Greenfylde - Knowledge Organisers

This term we will be introducing a new learning initiative, knowledge organisers, which we believe will make an impact to your child's learning and provide you, as parents and carers, a greater understanding in what your child is doing at school.


This half term we will be trialling Knowledge Organisers for one subject per key stage, EYFS – History, Key Stage One – Geography and Key Stage Two – Science.

Knowledge organisers are a tool which summarises key facts and essential knowledge that we teach in school, linking to the National Curriculum. Every time your child starts a new a new unit of work they will be given a knowledge organiser, this is essentially a "fact sheet" for the topic. Knowledge organisers will also be available online via Google Sites and Tapestry.

We will start "low-stakes quizzing;" reviewing and retrieving knowledge. We do these quizzes as it strengthens student memory and enables them to access more complex tasks. Increasing memory also helps students to think more creatively, critically and analytically.

Parents can support their children's education by discussing the information on the knowledge organisers with their son or daughter and quizzing them on what they know.







Well ... who would have believed that in 8 short weeks, the concept of SUNFLOWERS OF SOMERSET would have attracted so much attention! From the germ of an idea of two little boys, Arthur and Edward, who wanted to give out sunflower seeds to their neighbours during the Lockdown back in January, to now – a Community Project drawing together schools, churches, care homes, nurseries, cubs and scouts, shops and cafes, tourist attractions, craft groups and

artists and a grand total of around 6000 sunflower seeds distributed throughout Ilminster, Chard, Crewkerne, Taunton, Yeovil and many little villages in between! All growing sunflowers to beautify their towns and villages and to make people smile!

Since its launch as a Community Project on March 28 with a dedicated email address and Facebook page, SUNFLOWERS OF SOMERSET has distributed 650 leaflets with free seeds attached through outlets in shops, churches, garden centres, post offices and cafes and then delivered packs of seeds to 11 nurseries and pre-schools, 15 schools, 6 churches, 5 care homes, 5 Cubs and Scouts groups, 2 hotels, 2 Residents' Associations and 2 Tourist Offices so far! But time is running out and those little seeds



need to be in the ground within the next couple of weeks! We still have around 500 Giant Sunflower seeds and an equal number of Dwarf Seeds if anyone knows of someone or an organisation who can use them and we are still waiting on several other places who have not yet had time to respond to us

Photos of school children getting dirty, care home residents getting mucky fingers as well as the youngest planter (Asha aged 18 months) and Pip the Dog (yes!) all planting their seeds have been sent to us and all of them can be seen on our Facebook page. The Kitchen on Silver Street in Ilminster have a competition going on between the staff and their little pots can be seen in their shop windows! Crewkerne Hospital's patients and staff have created a beautiful Sunflower montage for their day room; Hornsbury Mill are so excited about

planting their 100 Giants in their grounds and organising an event or two, that they see themselves as 'Sunflower City!' Thurloxton Farm, who grew the most amazing sunflower meadows last year, have just planted out their zillions of seeds and are crossing their fingers that they will do as well this year. Meanwhile, up in North Somerset, Friends of Grove Park in Weston super Mare are busy filling their flowerbeds with 500 sunflowers to be planted by many different community groups and in Porlock, a 'Person from Porlock!' (ref. Samuel Taylor Coleridge's famous poem about Kublai Khan), is heading up a small team of volunteers to spread Sunflower Sunshine all around Porlock Village..... and so the list goes on.

Many schools are planning 'well-being days' to create sunflower art and poetry – Greenfylde School's work will be on display at The Minster and Swanmeade's at the Library in Ilminster. Neroche School in Broadway will have their work on show at Monks Yard in Horton Cross. More plans are afoot amongst other schools to do the same – watch this space for news! Residents of Horton Village are planning a Sunflower Trail of painted stones around their village and The Meeting House in Ilminster will be holding Sunflower Art workshops in the school summer holidays. Hats off to Tesco's in Ilminster who are sponsoring us to organise a children's Sunflower Bonnet Parade on the August Bank Holiday weekend with lots of prizes for 'best bonnets.'

There are 'Tallest Sunflower' competitions being planned, some gardening groups are planning photographic competitions and there are thoughts of a Teddy Bear's Sunflower Picnic as well as a

Sunflower craft fair on the agenda. So much happening ... so much sunflower activity within the next few months so exciting!

And it all kicks off during the first week of June with The Kitchen on Silver Street in Ilminster holding some 'Cuppa 'n' Colour' sessions – wellbeing and mindfulness colouring-in of sunflower pictures ... just go and relax with a latte and try your hand!

Other local businesses are coming on board too, the first one being 'Send a Little Joy' in Horton who have the most beautiful Sunflower greeting cards on sale. Check out their website here: www.sendalittlejoy.co.uk

We are hoping to get some Sunflower poetry under way and maybe some pictures for an exhibition too so are there any poets and artists among you? Please get in touch!
