Covid

A reminder that any information e.g if your child is waiting for a test or when they have received a result should be sent by email to the school office at <u>greenfylde@educ.somerset.gov.uk</u>. Your child must not come in if they have any Covid symptoms (high temperature, loss of taste/smell, new continuous cough). If your child has symptoms or is identified as a close contact, you should get a PCR test <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u> and not use lateral flow tests (LFTs) as these are not suitable for our age of children.

We are aware that families have been receiving different information from 119 and we are checking this with Public Health as the information we have been sharing is from the Government Guidance and the Support Services for Somerset toolkit.



Please can we ask as a polite reminder to check children's heads for head lice on a regular basis? They're easily transmissible and also easily treatable with a comb and conditioner.


#### Gates

Can we also remind please that the black Swanmead gates need closing as parents leave the site after drop off / collection times for the safety of the Swanmead site.




#### BEN MILLER DIARY OF A CHRISTMAS ELF

- active participation in a range of arts activities, including a personal response about what they have learnt from taking part
- experience of arts organisations, artists and their work
- creating a piece of art work
- identification of what they have enjoyed and/or achieved, and their communication of this to others

Once the young people have completed all four areas of the award, they will receive an entry level qualification in the Arts.
