


Swimming Pool

Feedback from our School Food Survey

Thank you to everyone who completed our survey at the end of last term. We had families representing 21 of our pupils respond, which is 6% of our school population. Of those who responded, 57% had school meals everyday, 33% some times had school meals and 10% never accessed school meals.

53% of those who had school meals stated that they enjoyed them, with 60% indicating pizza was their favourite meal. The highest dislike was vegetables at 21%.

From the comments we have done the following:

You said: Please can we have wider variety and more options

We did: Governors are currently looking at how we will source our school meals in September in the new school and we will ensure this, alongside the requests for more child friendly, high quality food will be key areas we require from any supplier. Where we have any concerns raised with meals currently we always pass these on directly to our supplier and ask them to act on the feedback.

You said: Please can KS2 meals be cheaper

We did: Unfortunately, suppliers have a similar pricing structure for all KS2 meals based around the agreed Government level for EYFS/KS1 meals. There is little variation in these and we appreciate the cost of meals can be difficult for families. We would always encourage families who think they may qualify to check if they are eligible for free school meals.

You said: Please can we know which meals children are eating each day **We did**: we appreciate it is difficult to check back on the app to see an overview of the meals. Moving forward we will aim to post the menu on our newsletter each time it changes so families always have access to a copy. We know some families screen shoot the menu on their mobile phones so they have it available in their gallery when required.

You said: Can children have jacket potatoes each day

We did: As a school, we have signed up to fully follow the School Food Guidance from the DfE, this means in balancing the weekly diet we are limited to the number of times jacket potatoes can be offered. Therefore it is not possible for us to offer jacket potatoes everyday.

We also want to ensure families are aware of UIFSM (Universal Infant Free School Meals) as 10% of respondents with children in these age groups were unaware of this. These free meals are funded by the Government for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 and children do not have to have these everyday and can just choose the days when advance booking when they would like to have the hot meal offered.

We also asked about food in wrap around care and following the comments we are asking the leads to look at how more variety could be included and to have more drinks available.





Covid

Whilst Covid legislation has changed, we are still asking families to support the school by following the Government's recommended guidance below. This will remain in place until tests are no longer available free, which we anticipate will be 1st April.

What to do if your child develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) or tests positive for COVID-19

Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are a new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia).

If your child develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), they should get a PCR test and remain at home at least until the result is known <u>and they are fever free</u> (without medication) for at least 24 hours.

If **negative**, the child can end self-isolation and return to school once well; If **positive**, the child should isolate until at least 10 days after their symptoms appeared. They may be able to leave isolation and return to school on day 6 if day 5 and day 6 lateral flow tests, tested at least 24 hours apart are both negative.

If the child has a positive test result, but does not have <u>symptoms</u>, they should stay at home and self-isolate for 10 days from the date the positive test was taken. Isolation can end early as above. Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for a PCR test (the normally available test type) and this can be arranged via <u>https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</u> or by calling 119.

A reminder that any information e.g if your child is waiting for a test or when they have received a result **must** be sent by email to the school office at <u>greenfylde@educ.somerset.gov.uk</u>, please don't send via School Comms as the office email is checked out of hours unlike the School Comms app. <u>We also request that you don't</u> <u>send this via Class Dojo or Tapestry.</u> Your child must not come in or be brought to school if they have any Covid symptoms.

When reporting absence please state the symptoms your child is experiencing as depending on these it changes their coding on the register. If we receive messages with just descriptions such as 'unwell/under the weather' then the office will need to follow this up with you in a telephone call. Please can we ask families to be respectful to any calls from the office re potential Covid illness as they are only following the Government guidance.

Welcome Back

Welcome back to all our families and hope you have all had a restful week off, with many adventures. Once again we look forward to hearing all the children's stories and adventures.

COVID

In light of the changes to the Government guidance from Thursday 24th February 2022, the following guidance has been issued.

Contact tracing has now ended nationally so we will no longer be informing parents where there is a positive case. The guidance has ended the need for close contacts to LFT for 7 days as well.

If a child has one of the 3 main Covid symptoms (high temperature, loss of taste/smell and/or new continuous cough) they will still need to get a PCR (not LFT) test. Whilst isolation is now guidance not law **we would strongly recommend that positive cases do isolate for at least 5 full days following their day 0** and have 2 clear, 24 hours apart LFTs (LFTs can still be sourced via <u>https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests</u>. This is the same advice we are giving to our staff to try and support our school community. Guidance will change again on the 1st April and we will update this when that happens.

We will keep contingencies in place if required and as per local Public Health guidance, these will come into use if the following occur:

A higher than previously experienced and/or rapidly increasing number of staff or student absences due to COVID-19 infection

Evidence of severe disease due to COVID-19, for example if a pupil, student, child or staff member is admitted to hospital due to COVID-19

A cluster of cases where there are concerns about the health needs of vulnerable staff or students within the affected group.

We hope this answers any questions you may have.

Entry/exit to school, focus on hygiene/cleaning and ventilation will remain as it was before half term.

Change of Clothes

Please could we ask that you ensure that your child has a change of clothes in their school bag. We do have free flow play outside / inside in most weathers. As we are sure you are aware children are always drawn to the tiniest amount of water.

Red Nose Day 2022

Advance notice – Friday 18th March is 'Red Nose Day' we would like to ask the children to wear something 'red' or if not anything that makes them happy. We are suggesting a donation of 50p per family be brought in on the day.
