How are we doing?

As we approach the end of the second week back we are continuing to enjoy getting to know the pupils again and help them settle back into the school routine. We also appreciate that some families have experienced the nationwide issues of getting tests when their child has had Covid symptoms and we thank you for your perseverance and patience in going through this process so that we are all following the guidance to keep each other safe. In the next part of the newsletter we have pasted a succinct summary by the Local Authority re the guidance for schools as we realise there is a lot of guidance out there for everyone to understand.

Our pupils have been fantastic in accepting all the new routines including coming in at the gates and we appreciate the support of families in making this a success. Please can we encourage you to keep social distancing (2m) between families lining up at the gates and helping us by following the coloured dots and only having one adult dropping off children wherever possible.

Coronavirus in children – symptoms and testing

We have been asked to share this advice by the Local Authority so that we have a County wide approach to keeping safe during Covid 19.

As we approach winter and more children are attending school and early years settings there is likely to be an increase in the number of children experiencing mild respiratory symptoms such as runny noses and colds. Children with these symptoms do not require self-isolation or testing for them or the wider family.

The three main symptoms of coronavirus in children are:

- **a high temperature** this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If any child in your setting displays these symptoms then it is very important that they are asked to go home, self-isolate with their family and get a test. They cannot return until they receive a negative test.

We need to ensure that we can prioritise testing for people displaying at least one of these three symptoms listed above. More information is available here:

Blended Learning

With everything going on currently with Covid 19, all schools have to have a blended learning plan that explains how we will ensure learning continues for pupils who may not be in school for a variety of reasons. In this week's newsletter we are including our plan and explaining what happens in a range of scenarios. If children are accessing this remote learning, we are now using Google Classroom alongside existing resources and we are currently following up with families where we are still seeking permission for this to be used by your child. Please have a look at the following sheets which also give guidance for using Google Classroom so please can you store this newsletter in a safe place for future reference – we will also put these on the front page of the website as well. In the interim, where children are off awaiting test results, learning has been emailed to them via the school office if families feel their children are well enough to complete the tasks. We hope this will support what may or may not happen in this current climate and will continue to monitor effectiveness to see if further changes are required.

Google for Education Information for parents



Google provides a set of online tools called G Suite for Education that can be used by schools as part of the education they plan for their learners. Children can follow links to prepare for learning or reinforce learning. They can create and save work with these tools during the school day and outside of the school day.

Opportunities for Learning

Children can learn individually and collaboratively using these tools within the security of the G suite for Education owned by the school:

- Google docs word processing software like Word
- Google slides presentation software like PowerPoint
- Google sheets spreadsheet software like Excel
- Google sites teachers and learners can create websites which remain private unless the school publishes them to the World Wide Web
- Google classroom allows teachers to set work and provide resources for learning.

The school is in control of the administration of G Suite tools. A primary school does not provide Gmail or Google calendar to learners unless there is a particular learning experience that would bring benefit to a group of key stage two children using these. They would only be made available for a set period of time and then removed. At all times the school administrator could view any emails and could disable the use if required.


Protecting Learner Data and Privacy

- The school keeps ownership of any data and documents. This never belongs to Google
 and is removed when the school removes it.
- There are no advertisements and no data is collected by Google for advertising purposes.
 When signed into G Suite for Education, children will not see any advertisements when they use Google to search for information. YouTube will be turned off for users within G Suite for Education unless the school has a purpose for allowing this.
- Google have signed the Student Privacy Pledge which was introduced by the Future of Privacy Forum and The Software and Information Industry Association. G Suite for Education complies with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FEPRA).
- The contract with G Suite for Education requires a school to get the parental consent that is required by Children's Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA).
- Google's security and data standards have been reviewed by independent auditors.
 Google systems are among the most secure and robust in the industry.

Online safety

The use of G Suite for Education provides an opportunity for children to experience positive and purposeful use of technology. Children learn the habits of keeping their username and password private. They learn the responsibility of working together in supportive ways.
